A message from Jonathan Gamble, Diocesan Accountant.

FRAUDULANT DIRECT DEBITS. Please be aware that a number of Parishes have reported Direct Debits going out of their account to VIRGIN MEDIA or VIRGIN MOBILE which they have never sent up or know anything about. These are fraudulent Direct Debits set up on our accounts and these will need to be reported to the Finance Team at the Curia, so that we can reclaim and cancel them with the bank. The question you may ask is why do Lloyds not stop these being set up, please see the response I received from Lloyds explaining this situation.

LLOYDS RESPONSE: I am sorry to say we do not hold set-up forms for these direct debits. This is because these direct debit forms were set using AUDDIS. I would like to explain this system in a little more detail. AUDDIS is a BACS service that allows an organisation ('Virgin Media' as an example) to set up, amend and cancel direct debit instructions electronically with their customers' Payment Service Provide (PSP). We (Lloyds) are the PSP in this instance. AUDDIS is an industry-wide method and now accounts for the vast majority of direct debit instructions. It is the responsibility of the originator (again, 'Virgin Media'' for example) to ensure they complete adequate security and verification checks when setting up AUDDIS direct debits for their customers. The bank have no involvement in this whatsoever, nor do we have any involvement in setting up the direct debits - as mentioned, it is all done electronically. Due to this, there is no way the bank can prevent direct debits being set up via AUDDIS. However, you are protected by the Direct Debit Indemnity Guarantee Scheme, meaning that the bank will ALWAYS refund you should any direct debits be claimed without authorisation. There is also NO TIME LIMIT in which an Indemnity Claim can be raised after the event. I can see that these direct debits already show as cancelled. Please let us know if you need us to assist you with any indemnity claims. You can also report these to Action Fraud. Their telephone number is 0300 123 2040. Background on the Gospel Reading Matthew 17:1-9.

Jesus is transfigured on the mountain in the presence of Peter, James, and John.

Today's liturgy invites us to celebrate the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. This feast calls to our attention the importance of this event in Jesus' life, further affirmed by its report in each of the Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In Cycle A, the reading for this feast is taken from the Gospel of Matthew. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter confesses his belief that Jesus is the Messiah and after Jesus predicts his Passion.

In each of these Gospels, a discussion of the cost of discipleship precedes the Transfiguration. In each Gospel, Jesus takes three of his disciples—Peter, James, and John—to a high mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear and converse with Jesus. Elijah and Moses are both significant figures in the history of Israel. Moses led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and received from Yahweh the Ten Commandments. Moses represents the Law, which guides the lives of the Jewish people. Elijah is one of the most important prophets of Israel who helped the Israelites stay faithful to Yahweh, and some believed that Elijah's return would signal the coming of the Messiah for the Jewish people. The appearance of these two figures from Israel's history indicated Jesus' continuity with the Law and the prophets. They also reveal that Jesus is the fulfilment of all that was promised to the people of Israel.

Upon witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, an awestruck Peter offered to construct three tents for them when a voice from Heaven affirms that Jesus is "my beloved Son" and commands the disciples to listen to him.

In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructed the disciples to keep secret what they had seen until after "the Son of Man has been raised from the dead." Until they witnessed Jesus' Passion and Death, the disciples could not possibly understand what he meant by being "raised from the dead." We, however, have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of the Transfiguration Gospel, we see an anticipation of Jesus' Resurrection, a foreshadowing of Christ's glory in Heaven, and the promise of our own resurrection.

At this time we remember the devastation caused in Hiroshima and Nagasaki when the atomic bombs were dropped, on 6 and 9 August 1945, and we pray that nuclear weapons will be abolished so that they can never be used again. In his message, 'A Culture of Care as a Path to Peace', Pope Francis asks, 'How many resources are spent on weaponry, especially nuclear weapons, that could be used for more significant priorities such as ensuring the safety of individuals, the promotion of peace and integral human development, the fight against poverty, and the provision of health care'. In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi.
