A message from Jonathan Gamble, Diocesan Accountant.

FRAUDULANT DIRECT DEBITS. Please be aware that a number of Parishes have reported Direct Debits going out of their account to VIRGIN MEDIA or VIRGIN MOBILE which they have never sent up or know anything about. These are fraudulent Direct Debits set up on our accounts and these will need to be reported to the Finance Team at the Curia, so that we can reclaim and cancel them with the bank. The question you may ask is why do Lloyds not stop these being set up, please see the response I received from Lloyds explaining this situation.

LLOYDS RESPONSE: I am sorry to say we do not hold set-up forms for these direct debits. This is because these direct debit forms were set using AUDDIS. I would like to explain this system in a little more detail. AUDDIS is a BACS service that allows an organisation ('Virgin Media' as an example) to set up, amend and cancel direct debit instructions electronically with their customers' Payment Service Provide (PSP). We (Lloyds) are the PSP in this instance. AUDDIS is an industry-wide method and now accounts for the vast majority of direct debit instructions. It is the responsibility of the originator (again, 'Virgin Media',' for example) to ensure they complete adequate security and verification checks when setting up AUDDIS direct debits for their customers. The bank has no involvement in this whatsoever, nor do we have any involvement in setting up the direct debits - as mentioned, it is all done electronically. Due to this, there is no way the bank can prevent direct debits being set up via AUDDIS. However, you are protected by the Direct Debit Indemnity Guarantee Scheme, meaning that the bank will ALWAYS refund you should any direct debits be claimed without authorisation. There is also NO TIME LIMIT in which an Indemnity Claim can be raised after the event. I can see that these direct debits already show as cancelled. Please let us know if you need us to assist you with any indemnity claims. You can also report these to Action Fraud. Their telephone number is 0300 123 2040. Background on the Gospel Reading Matthew 14.22-33.

Jesus walks on water, and the disciples acknowledge him as the Son of God.

Today's Gospel directly follows last week's account of Jesus feeding a crowd of more than 5,000 people with just five loaves of bread and two fish. For the sake of the crowds, Jesus had postponed his time of solitude. Now, at last, Jesus finds some time for quiet and prayer. He sends his disciples ahead of him by boat, dismisses the crowds, and then withdraws to the mountain to pray.

The disciples do not fare well. They struggle to weather the wind and waves, making little progress in their journey. We are reminded of a previous story in <u>Chapter 8</u>, of Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus calms the seas. This time, however, Jesus does not calm the seas, and the disciples do not express fear until they see Jesus walking toward them on the water. In this story it is not the storm that is feared but the sight of Jesus before them, whom they mistake for a ghost.

Clues like these suggest that this story is about the disciples' growing understanding of the identity of Jesus. In continuity with <u>last week's Gospel</u> about the feeding of the multitude, today's Gospel is also about what the disciples' faith in Jesus will enable them to do. In last week's Gospel, when the disciples see the crowds, they ask Jesus to send the crowds away. Jesus turns the situation around, telling the disciples to feed the crowd with the provisions that they have. Both of these Gospels tell us much about ministry.

Jesus calls to the disciples and calms their fears. He is not a ghost. The impulsive Peter seeks proof that the person is indeed Jesus. He asks Jesus to call him out onto the water, and Jesus grants this request. Peter's fear and doubt overtake him, however, once he is walking on the water. Jesus reaches out to Peter and saves him. When Jesus and Peter enter the boat, Matthew reports that the wind ceases, and the disciples confess that Jesus is the Son of God.

Faith in Jesus will enable the disciples to do the work that Jesus has done. Peter walks on water. The five loaves and two fish feed a multitude of people. The disciples can and will participate in the work of the kingdom of heaven. When Peter fears and doubts the person of Jesus, however, he falters. Peter's example teaches us that true Christian ministry emerges from the faith that Jesus is the Messiah, God's only Son.

Words of the Holy Father: What type of faith is great? Great faith is that which brings its own story, marked even by wounds, and brings it to the Lord's feet asking Him to heal them, to give them meaning. Each one of us has our own story and it is not always a story "of export", it is not always a clean story... Many times, it is a difficult story, with a lot of pain, many misfortunes and many sins. What do I do with my story? Do I hide it? No! We must bring it before the Lord. "Lord, if You will it, you can heal me!" This is what this woman teaches us, this wonderful mother: the courage to bring our own painful story before God, before Jesus, to touch God's tenderness, Jesus's tenderness. Let's try this story, this prayer: let each one of us think of his or her own story. There are always ugly things in a story, always. Let us go to Jesus, knock on Jesus's heart and say to Him: "Lord, if You will it, you can heal me!" And we can do this if we always have the face of Jesus before us, if we understand what Christ's heart is like, what Jesus's heart is like: a heart that feels compassion, that bears our pains, that bears our sins, our mistakes, our failures. But it is a heart that loves us like that, as we are, without make-up: He loves us like that. "Lord, if You will it, you can heal me!"
